Dress Code Standard

San Diego County School's Dancesport Championship 2009
Sunday May 31, 2009

Appropriate attire is required. The Organizer determines the standard of the dress code. Anyone not adhering to the dress code will not be allowed to dance, or will be disqualified if they dance and no refunds will be given for entry fees, tickets, etc.

Below is information on appropriate attire for the competition. Often students will coordinate color/outfits with one another. This is only a suggestion, and is *not* required.

Appropriate attire for lady dancers:

A dress or skirt/blouse that would be worn to attend a wedding, graduation or Sunday school. See through, or revealing dress will not be tolerated. Uniforms are also acceptable attire. Dresses should be no shorter than one inch right above the knee and no longer than ankle. Girl's dresses should be modest; no bare midriff or exposed bellies will be tolerated. Girl's shoes should not be backless or strapless. Due to possible injuries shoes with **heels higher than 1.5 inches are not permitted. No flip flops or tennis shoes.** Make up and hair is of the discretion of the parent. If your daughter has long hair it is should be pulled back or up.

Appropriate attire for gentlemen dancers:

A button up long sleeve shirt, slacks and a tie, either clip on or regular. School uniforms are also acceptable attire. Gentlemen dancers should wear dress shoes. If the boy's hair is long, it should be held back or slicked back into a band. A clean cut appearance is requested.
